



When you came to your first Cub meeting, your leaders may have welcomed you as a “Tenderpad”. The name “Tenderpad” refers to the soft skin on the bottom of a real wolf cub’s feet. The older wolves help the Tenderpads learn about the pack, and while they learn, the Tenderpad’s feet grow tough. By the time Tenderpads have learned how to work together as a team, their feet have become tough enough to follow the Wolf pack on adventures.

As a Tenderpad, you will be given a pack neckerchief, (Cubs call a scarf a “neckerchief”) at your first Cub meeting to wear with your new Cub uniform. The neckerchief is to identify and welcome you as a new pack member. Your next step as a Tenderpad is to learn about being a Wolf Cub. The leaders and older Cubs will help you. If you remember to always do your best while you learn, then soon your feet will grow tough. You will then be able to run not only with the pack, but also on your own adventures.
